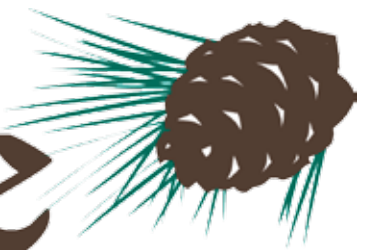
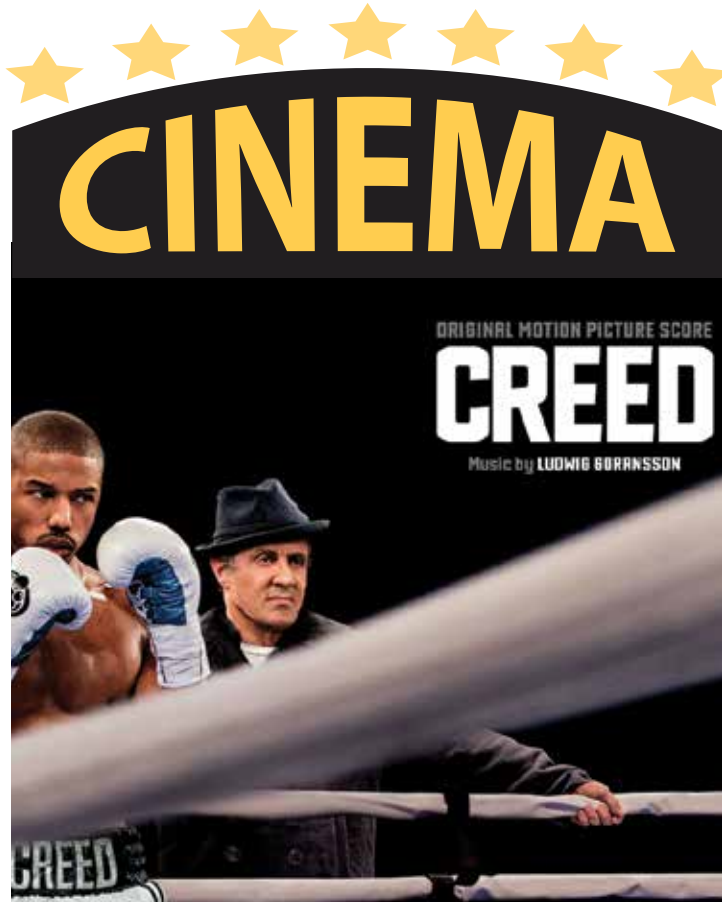

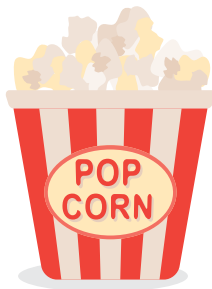

Mosquito-prevention project

Fairfax County treats our street storm drains (about 80 of them) for mosquitos by tossing larvicide packets (mosquito dunks) into them three times between mid-May & mid-October, which helps to prevent mosquitos from successfully reproducing. This does not prevent them from reproducing in our off-street storm drains (we have about 25), which are in our parks, our alleyways and drainage culverts behind our homes, usually just upstream from our street drains.

After an educational walkaround with a representative from the Fairfax Department of Environmental Health, the Maintenance Committee decided to order mosquito dunks and mirror the county's street drain program with our own off-street program, three times a season.

The first round has been completed and there will be two more, one around August 1 and the last around mid-October.

We can also use these dunks in problem areas of stagnant standing water that remain for more than seven days (it takes a larva 7–10 days to become a mosquito).

Although this project will help eliminate some mosquitos, we learned that nearly all the bites we get are from mosquitos that breed right in our own yards, or within a very short distance. The Fairfax representative, a scientist, showed us that any container which can hold water for 7–10 days or more will be capable of breeding mosquitos.

In our own yards, he showed us pet water bowls, spare tires, bird baths and other items all containing water. The simple solution to preventing mosquitos is to simply remove these items, or at least to dump the water out before it stagnates.

If homeowners do nothing more than monitor and manage their own yards, it will eliminate nearly all mosquitos.

Board happenings

Board happenings

At its June 9, 2016 meeting, the Board of Directors:

Heard a community comment on the Board's establishment of guidelines to improve communication and the relationship between the Association and the grounds contractor. The homeowner believes the threshold of \$5,000 under which the contractor is given right of refusal on items outside of the grounds contract but still grounds-related is too high. The homeowner also noted the item was omitted from the May Board minutes. The Board Secretary stated that the omission was inadvertent and that he works to ensure transparency and openness in the minutes.

Was introduced to a new homeowner.

Heard a community comment about apparent drug deals on a street in the community. This has been and will continue to be reported to the police.

Heard a reminder about the Community Yard Sale on June 11 from 8 a.m.–1 p.m.

Heard reports from the Committee Liaisons: the pool is now open; the ACC is working on a standard for exterior motion lights and reviewing the possibility of allowing benches in front yards; the Maintenance Committee has been working on the grounds contract statement of work and map, the bridge replacement recommendation, and a proposal for needed path work.

Selected a new collections attorney for the Association.

Tabled the Collections Resolution for discussion until the month after the Board meets with the new collections attorney.

Approved the proposed grounds contract statement of work to be sent out for competitive bidding.

Approved the proposed snow contract statement of work.

Deferred discussion of the DCCR revision to the September Board meeting.

Heard that the Maintenance Committee has authorized the purchase of a boom to help collect trash in the lake near the Lawrence Street inlets.

Approved a proposal from National Paving in an amount not to exceed \$45,000 to remove and repave selected paths throughout the community.

Approved the Maintenance Committee's recommendation to spend up to \$100,000 for the purchase and installation of a replacement bridge at the lake. The bridge

will be in the Contour style in powder-coated black aluminum from Crane Materials International.

Added the area by the perimeter fence at the end of Amblewood Road to the grounds contract statement of work.

Approved up to \$1,650 for the purchase of a larger popcorn machine and cart for the Cinema Committee's use, because demand for popcorn is so high at the movies.

Voted to review the employee evaluation form at the July Board meeting.

Deferred discussion of emergency preparedness to the August Board meeting.

Appointed Walter and Donna Wright as Co-Chairs for the Pool Committee.

Reconstituted the Contracts Committee with Mike Shigley as Chair and Bev Card, Nancy Razzino, Sal Simonetta, Maggie Srivastav, and Edna Burns as members. This committee will function as described in the recently approved contract process.

Heard about the meeting with a county Environmental Health Specialist regarding advice on mosquito control solutions.

Authorized the Community Manager to seek clarification from an attorney on the most recent County letter regarding the compound shed and the County's requirement for a reduced number of spaces for homeowner recreational vehicles.

Agreed to discuss at the August Board meeting possible installation of dog waste stations in the community.

Authorized the Community Manager to seek an opinion on a homeowner account from the new collections attorney.

Authorized hiring an attorney to represent the Association in a contract litigation matter if necessary. \$5,000 was previously approved as a retainer.

At its July 14 meeting, the Board anticipates meeting with the new collections attorney and reviewing the employee evaluation form.

In and around Pinewood on the 4th

If you think you will travel to the National Mall for the 4th of July fireworks this year, here are a few tips:

Fireworks begin at 9:00 p.m. from the Reflecting Pool area and only last 17 minutes and 30 seconds.

Plan to arrive early, and to protect yourself from heat-related illness.

Be prepared to go through security checkpoints to view the fireworks from the National Mall, especially near the Washington Monument and Reflecting Pool.

The fireworks are loud, and you should consider wearing hearing protection.

It may not be best to bring your pets, as they could be startled by the loud noises.

After the fireworks, Independence Avenue between the Lincoln and World War II Memorials will be closed to clean up debris from the fireworks.

Other viewing areas:

- Washington D.C.: U.S. Capitol, Lincoln Memorial, Franklin Delano Roosevelt Memorial, Thomas Jefferson Memorial, The White House Ellipse, West Potomac Park, East Potomac Park, Anacostia Park.
- Virginia: U.S. Marine Corps War Memorial and the George Washington Memorial Parkway.
- If you can find a spot near the Pentagon, you can get a great view from the water side.

There are also small boat tours out of National Harbor and Georgetown that will take you out on the Potomac River for a small fee. If you take this option, the fireworks will feel like they are almost on top of you. This is a great option if you want a different experience.

What not to bring:

- Guns, knives, or ammunition
- Drones
- Alcohol
- Glass containers
- Explosives or fireworks

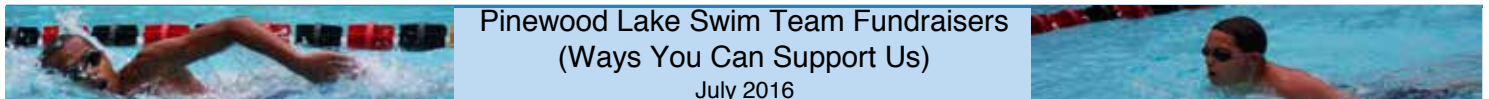

Dear Community Support Liaison (CSL):

I notice the new trash collection requirements for brush materials and placing debris in paper bags, but can you remind us of the electronic recycling procedures?

Response: You can E-Cycle electronic items safely and correctly and ensure they don't go to the landfill. Rather than buying a brand new computer, you may wish to consider upgrading the hardware or software on your existing device instead. If that's not possible, make sure to delete all personal information from the unit before disposing of the item. Don't forget to remove the batteries, as they are recycled differently.
