Important yard waste service change

Now must be in paper bags or separate trash can

Fairfax County Solid Waste Management Program has recently changed its requirements for the disposal of yard waste due to changes in the region's composting facilities. They will no longer be accepting yard waste in plastic bags.

As of June 1, they require the use of paper yard waste bags, or setting your yard waste out in a reusable trash can marked for yard waste.

Thirty-gallon paper yard waste bags can be purchased at some of these local stores:

- K-Mart
- Sears
- Lowes
- Target
- Walmart
- Wegmans



Nightingale Trucking Company, our trash and recycling collection contractor, also suggests collecting yard waste in a rubber trash can marked "Yard Waste" with a permanent marker.

Leash and curb your dog

Fairfax County has laws about owning a dog.

Dog licenses are mandatory in Fairfax county. A license costs only \$10.

Scoop your poop. Yes, it's a law. Pick up your dog's waste.

Dogs must be on a leash whenever they are outside your home, with the exception of some county-run off-leash dog parks. If found without a leash or collar, your pet could end up in the animal shelter.

Don't tie them up. Leashes are good as long as you are at the other end. It is illegal to tether a dog for more than one hour.

Violation of Fairfax County dog laws can result in a fine of up to \$250.

Ask the CSL

Dear Community Support Liaison (CSL):
We use plastic trash bags for garbage and our blue bin for recycling. But we're doing some major yard work — trimming our tree and shrubbery. How do we clean up properly?

Response: Homeowners need to make sure when they are having work done that their contractor removes all the rubbish, tree trunks, limbs, brush, and construction materials as part of their agreement.

As of June 1, all yard waste is to be disposed of in paper yard waste bags or in reusable trash cans marked "Yard Waste." Yard waste will not be accepted in plastic bags. The PLHA trash contractor will remove up to ten bags of yard waste, per unit, placed at the curb.

For more substantial brush — the woody part of yard debris such as tree trimmings or prunings, with a diameter of six inches or less, and logs three inches or less in diameter — be sure it is free of metal or rock, and tie it in bundles less than four feet in length. No more than five bundles will be collected at a time.

No brush or other trash is to be taken to the community compound on Saint Annes Court or placed on any common grounds. If you witness a neighbor dumping in these areas, please contact the office and report the violation. Thanks again to our volunteers who work hard to keep our parks and common grounds picked up and litter free.

Board happenings

Board happenings

- At its May 12, 2016 meeting, the Board of Directors:
- Heard a community comment on the new grass in front of the office.
- Answered a homeowner question on whether Board members must be residents (answer: no, according to the governing documents).
- Heard there was a theft of a child's wagon from a front yard on Lakepark Dr.
- Heard reminders about the Yard Sale on June 11 and the pool opening on May 28.
- Heard from a homeowner who is opposed to additional parking spaces being put in place of green space in the cul-de-sac on Saint Annes Court but who would support extra parking for the street inside of the compound at the end of the street.
- Heard that Fairfax County has changed its procedures so that the trash company can now only accept yard debris in paper lawn bags (available for purchase online, at home improvement stores, some grocery stores, and discount stores) or reusable trash cans with "Yard Waste" clearly marked on the outside.
- Heard that although Vicki McLeod has moved, she will serve out her term on the Board through December 2016 and is willing to be the Association's contact on state street conditions and other similar issues.
- Heard reports from the Committee Liaisons: the pool is being prepared for opening on May 28, the ACC is getting three new members, the Maintenance Committee has been working on the grounds contract statement of work and will have a bridge replacement recommendation for the Board next month.
- Edna Burns reported that there is no new information available on the Pinewood Lake school site.
- Removed the security article from the Board's agenda.
- Tabled the Collections Resolution for discussion when the Association has selected a new collections attorney. The Community Manager will contact attorneys referred by Rich Hall and bring information to the Board in June.
- Discussed the possible Saint Annes Court parking solutions. The Board saw only one feasible option of putting 1-2 extra spaces by the driveway into the compound, but it will be a long-term project that can only be addressed once the compound shed project

- is completed. Maggie Srivastav will draft a flyer to the residents of Saint Annes Court letting them know the status of their petition for parking solutions.
- Approved a proposal from Premium Lawn and Landscape for \$1,950 to clear the area by the lower pool parking lot.
- Approved the ACC Request for 8140 Lakepark to install a motion sensor light on the side of the home. The light shall be angled so that it does not shine on any other home or yard.
- Appointed Jim Fetzner, Edna Burns, and Taryn Pyle to the ACC.
- Reviewed the draft grounds contract statement of work and provided feedback for incorporation into a revised draft for approval at the June meeting.
- Approved reimbursing the swim team for the first vending machine fill of the season in an amount not to exceed \$500.
- Guaranteed the swim team coaches' salaries in an amount not to exceed \$2,000 if the swim team is unable to raise all of the necessary funds for this summer.
- Heard from the MCA that some homeowners have been placing items for trash pickup in front of the compound and directed that the MCA provide a flyer to homeowners about appropriate trash procedures.
- Heard that a county Environmental Health Specialist would make a visit to the community to conduct an assessment of common grounds and to advise on mosquito control solutions.
- Heard from a homeowner requesting that the Association consider allowing lawn furniture in front yards during the warm months. The ACC will review the proposal.
- Heard about the results of a recent County inspection at the compound resulting from a complaint about mosquitoes at the compound.
- Wrote off a homeowner's balance due to foreclosure.

At its June 9 meeting, the Board anticipates discussing the grounds contract statement of work, a new collections attorney, and emergency preparedness. If you have any questions about the Board Happenings, please feel free to contact me at 703-360-6212 or plha@verizon.net.




